1. Project Overview

The goal of this report is to provide the economic impact of new construction and projects landed in 2019 and 2020 in Cass County.

2. Model & Assumptions

3. Summary

- During the two years of construction, the \$20.7 million in construction activity helps support 176 jobs in the construction industry and an additional 43 jobs in the community based on the increased economic activity.
- When fully operational, the economic activity generated by these projects in the area will add about \$413.4 million to the local economy each year.
 - o Includes activity directly related to the company's operations and associated "spillover" activity.
- The 276 jobs at the five projects help support an additional 265 workers in the community.
 - Additional workers include warehousing and storage, real estate, retail, restaurants, accountants, etc.
- The Cass County economy sees a boost to payroll income of about \$29.2 million for
 jobs directly related to the operations of the project, additional business-to-business
 spending, and additional household spending.
