

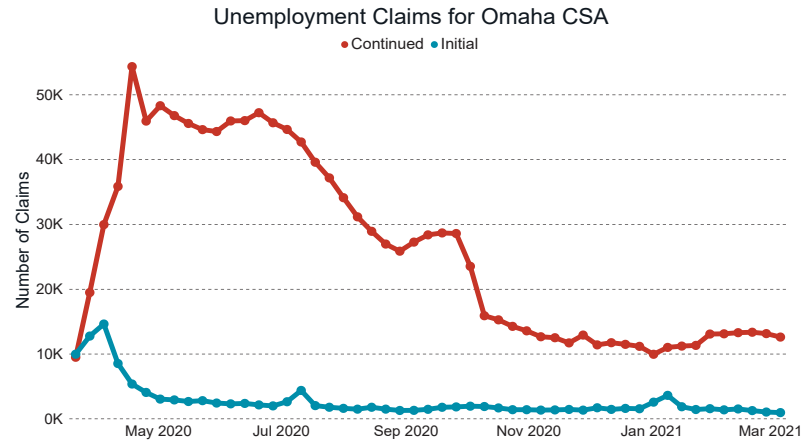
GREATER OMAHA ECONOMIC INDICATORS

01 2021

HIGHLIGHTS

Greater Omaha is continuing to see the effects of the coronavirus on the economy, but we are beginning to see some improvements compared to April 2020. April 2020 has been our reference point for economic recovery since it was the first full month of restrictions and temporary business closings. The unemployment rate fell from 9.9% in April 2020 to 3.6% in January 2021, which is above Nebraska's (3.1%) but below the U.S. (6.8%). Greater Omaha has seen an increase of approximately 24,900 net jobs compared to April 2020. The industries that have seen the largest increase are Leisure and Hospitality (44.4%), Trade, Transportation and Utilities (8.2%) and Education and Health Services (4.5%). Eppley had 74,500 passenger enplanements in January 2021, up from 8,700 in April 2020.

COVID-19



As we continue to monitor the effects of the coronavirus on the Omaha metro, we are tracking the initial and continued unemployment insurance claims as a leading indicator. The most recent week, ending on March 6, saw over 900 initial claims and 12,500 continued claims.
